A Message from Fr. Torvend

A pioneer among us

It is Friday, July 1, an auspicious date among Episcopalians as on this day the Rev. Anna Pauline Murray entered eternal life. "Pauli," as she was known by her friends, was the first Black woman to be ordained a priest in the Episcopal Church. Prior to her entrance into public ministry, she served the people of God as a civil rights and gender equity lawyer and



law professor. In 1940, she sat with a friend in a "whites-only" section of a bus in Virginia and was promptly arrested. Her arrest and her involvement with the Socialist Workers' Defense League prompted her to enter law school at Howard University: the only woman in her class and its valedictorian. She went on to earn a doctorate in jurisprudence from Yale. In 1977, she was ordained to the order of priest after having studied at General Theological Seminary in New York. She entered public ministry because, in her words, she was inspired by the work of Episcopal lay women who worked tirelessly for women's rights and civil




Parish Profile Report

Laudato Si means "Praise be to you (O LORD)," the beginning of the Canticle of Creation composed by St. Francis of Assisi in the 13th century.
