A Message from Fr. Torvend

write this note close to the shore of Lake Sagatagan, one of the lakes on the land cared for by the monks of Saint John's Abbey in central Minnesota, one of the largest Benedictine abbeys in the world. I am here for a confer-

ence on Christian spirituality.
On the other side of the guesthouse where I'm staying is one of the largest solar farms in Minnesota if not the

Upper Midwest (see photo). The monastic community has made serious commitments to rely on solar energy rather than fossils fuels (coal and gasoline) - the culprits in global warming. Between caring for the lakes and using solar energy to power the abbey and its large university, we find a Christian community asking how their actions in the present will shape the future for those who come to this place for worship, study, and service.

As an Episcopal parish, Christ Church is part of an **international network** committed to "cherish the wondrous works of God, and protect and restore the beauty and integrity of all creation." We support a vigorous effort to diminish the harmful effects of human-produced warming of the planet and the destruction it leaves in its wake: this is the most continued on page 3

Does the candidate have a record of supporting actions (not just rhetoric) that conserve and protect the earth - whether that's the Puget Sound, waterways, greenways, and land? Look carefully at those who are asking to represent us in city, state, and federal offices: their decisions and legislation will affect the future of our island home, the earth. ~ Fr. Torvend



LGBTQ event: Early on the morning of Saturday, June 28, 1969, LGBTQ people rioted following a police raid on the Stonewall Inn in the Greenwich Village neighborhood of Lower Manhattan, New York City. The Stonewall Inn was a gay bar which catered to an assortment of patrons, but which was popular with the most marginalized people in the gay community: transvestites, transgender people, effemin ate young men, hustlers, and homeless youth.<sup>1</sup>

Today's Pride events are a celebration of gay rights, along with a remembrance of the events at the Stonewall Inn, the victims of AIDS, and those who have been victims of anti-LGBT violence.

Henrietta's Kitchen

Garretson and Lemuel Henry
Wells met in Walla Walla,
Washington,

where Henrietta served as the principal of St. Paul's School for Girls, an institution Lemuel had established in the early

1870s while serving as founding rector of St. Paul's church. The two were married in 1880. Lemuel described the couple's

coming to Tacoma in his charming memoir, A Pioneer Missionary:

... Bishop Paddock, who in 1880 had come to the State of Washington, visited us... and told us that a beautiful stone church had been built in Tacoma and urged me to [come to Tacoma]. He added that Mr. C.B. Wright had promised to give fifty thousand dollars to endow a girls' boarding school if Bishop Paddock would raise the money to build it and he wished Mrs. Wells to come and organize it and become its first principal.

And so this late19<sup>th</sup> century "power couple" arrived in Tacoma in 1883. While Lemuel served as rector of St.
Luke's church (prior to the merger that resulted in Christ Church) Henrietta took up her post as principal of Annie Wright Semi-
