A Message from Fr. Torvend

Friday, July 22, the feast of a maligned saint

n the 6th century, Gregory of Rome wrongly confused Mary Magdalene with an unnamed woman in the gospels who was thought to be a repentant prostitute. NO AND NO AGAIN. Mary Magdalene was one of the women who financed Jesus' movement (unusual in a culture that viewed women as utterly dependent on men), who was faithful to him through his grueling passion and death, who was commis-

sioned by him as the first preacher of his resurrection, and was a missionary leader of the Jesus movement that spread throughout the Mediterranean. That her memory was overlooked in later years as Christianity was overwhelmed by cultural patriarchy was a tragic loss. That she and many other women, prominent in the life of Jesus and the early Christian community, have come to light through the diligent work of historians is a blessing and continued on page 3

Did you miss our trip to England?


If you missed our trip to England in June, you can read the three essays created by Fr. Torvend here.



uppressed and Sabotaged: The Fight to Vote is a powerful documentary about the growing threat of voter suppression and election sabotage to our 2022 midterm elections. In 2021, 19 states passed 34 new voter laws following the Big Lie of the 2020 election. The film focuses on this recent wave of voter suppression and subversion laws being enacted in states, and how the 2018 Georgia gubernatorial race between Stacey Abrams and Brian Kemp provides a case study for understanding today's voter suppression laws across the country.

Suppression tactics covered in the film include: deliberate barriers to registration; polling place closures; voter purges; missing absentee ballots; extreme wait times at polling locations; exact match disqualifications; new vote by mail limitations; changes to ballot collection and drop off and more. Voter suppression laws disproportionately affect American Students, Senior Citizens, Black, Indigenous, Latine, and People of Color from casting their ballots. Suppressed and Sabotaged 2022 is a call to action against the calculated, unconstitutional and racist attacks intended to suppress the right to vote in America. 
