Final Call for Diocesan Convention Candidates



Rental Update

Deborah continues to secure recurring rentals of our many spaces. So far, we have contractual arrangements with the Contra Dancers, Wellspring, the Esoterics, and the NW Repertory Singers.

Adult Formation

Adult Formation in the Fall is a full schedule of offerings including the continuation of EX-PLORE for those who want to affiliate with Christ Church, classes, workshops, a public lecture on animal rights and Christian faith, coffee hours with newcomers, the chance for all Christ Church members to take a Spiritual Gifts Inventory, a ministry fair, and a special Advent Quiet Morning.

Newcomers: Nine adults have recently indicated their desire to affiliate with Christ Church. In addition, one former member has indicated their desire to return to our parish. Fr. Torvend and I will be hosting "Newcomer Coffee Hours is September and November. This, combined with the reinstitution of our Small Group Dinners will provide a means to welcome and incorporate newcomers into our community.

Children's Faith Formation

We are busy planning for the launch of Godly Play this Fall. One parishioner has expressed interest in joining me in this ministry. We will use the Fall to train and develop the program.

<u>Congregational Development Grant</u> <u>Proposal</u>

To support expansion of *Music at Christ* Church, a Congregational Development Grant application was submitted on Wednesday, June 22, 2022. We expect to hear anytime regarding our success in securing this grant. We requested \$24,750.

John Taylor Engagement:

John Taylor began his work on June 16 with a visit to our grounds. John will present his initial findings in September to a group of Vestry and Finance Committee members.

Parish Profile Committee:

The Parish Survey has been completed. At our well attended Town Hall meeting Sunday, August 7 where the Congregational Assessment was shared, Gordon Craig reminded us that before we make action plans for our future, we need to figure out our "Why". Gordon is absolutely right.


The "Why" for Christ Church Tacoma

Author Simon Sinek explains that the companies or service organizations that survive are those that understand "why" they exist. He states, "People don't buy what you do, they

buy why you do it."

Sinek has created a model called the Golden Circle (depicted below)



I believe our "Why" is contained in our Mission Statement.

We are an accepting Episcopal parish renewing its people as disciples of Jesus Christ through worship, prayer, music, the visual arts, formation, service, and acts of justice and peace.

The question at this point is whether we as a parish are still aligned around this statement. I ask you to prayerfully consider the following: Does our mission statement reflect all that we believe about ourselves? What we value? Our purpose in the community? Who we wish to become in the future?

Only when we reaffirm or modify our mission statement (the "Why"), can we create meaningful action plans around the "How" and the "What."

The How: is the means by which *The Why* is made tangible. The "How" at Christ Church:

- Budget support for our Ministries of Music, Adult Formation, Service
- Congregational and Leadership support of worship, prayer, the visual arts
- Justice and peace through our outreach efforts

The "What" are the tactics or services we provide to make our "Why" become a reality.

Current Examples: Third Friday Music Series, Concerts in the Courtyard, Outreach to the Veterans Village.

Sinek makes a strong point that people will not be inspired to join us by "what" we do, rather by "why" we do it. I urge you all to learn more about Sinek's model by listening to his short TED Talk at the following link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?

We will continue to engage in conversation around our Mission Statement. In the meantime, I would love to hear your thoughts.

Community: Concerts at Christ Church

h my goodness!" and "Wow!" were the phrases I heard over and over as **Wellspring Ensemble** members filed into the church for their rehearsal last Monday night. All but two of the Seattle-based singers had never been inside, and all of them were in awe of the space.

The voices began singing, their appreciation for Christ Church's acoustics growing as the sounds of lush *legato* and crunchy jazz-inspired chords filled the air.

Wellspring Ensemble is just one of the three outstanding choral groups who will be appearing in Christ Church this season; the NW Repertory Singers, a Tacoma choir that has been

around since 2001, and the **Esoterics,** a Seattle group now in its twenty-ninth season, will also be per-

forming at this venue. In addition, we have inquiries from another Seattle-based choral group and a Tacoma string quartet who wish to return next season. And, the NW Repertory Singers will be here each week from this coming week all the way through to the spring for their rehearsals on Monday evenings, making Christ Church their main location.

The excellent acoustics of the Christ Church

Sanctuary are just one of the reasons musicians are inquiring about performances here. In addition to its convenient mid-town location, the size of the space itself, and ease of arranging events here, the word is out: **this congregation** is filled with music-lovers. Small music organizations such as these don't have a lot of resources to pursue advertising, and hope that members of the congregation will wish to attend their concerts, even agreeing to a higher rental fee in exchange for promotion to our church congregation. This means that your attendance at concerts here is a vital part of the performers' ability to return.

Christ Church is warmly rewarded by these performances: not only will you have wonderful

musical opportunities in your own church space plus the rent received from the organization, there's another bonus.

At the end of the rehearsal, a Wellspring singer remarked, "My mother has been planning on coming to a service at this church for a while, but just hasn't done it. She's coming to this concert, and I'm going to tell her she should come on Sunday morning as well." ~ Deborah Breneman

Jazz in the Courtyard: David Joyner

avid Deacon-Joyner is a pianist, composer, arranger, lecturer, and educator, and owner of DDJ Music Services. He has over thirty years experience as professor of jazz studies at the University of North Texas and Pacific Lutheran University and has adjudicated at jazz festivals all over the United States. He has performed all over the world and has composed and/ or arranged music for symphony orchestras and jazz big bands throughout the United States, including collaborations with saxophonist Jeff Coffin (Dave Matthews Band) and Caleb Chapman (president of the Jazz Education Network). His textbook, American Popular Music (McGraw-Hill/Cengage, 3rd ed.) has been in print since 1993 and he has just completed a biography of rock 'n' roll founding father Bill Haley. Locally, David performs regularly with Puget Sound area musicians, including his own Tacoma-based Grit City Jazz Octet.



Wyatt Smith, Harpsichordist, in Concert

Dr. Wyatt Smith, (Affiliate Artist, Organ and Harpsichord, University of Puget Sound) performs the complete Goldberg Variations (BWV 988) in **Wells Hall. September 9th**, at **8:00pm**.

Dr. Wyatt Smith, a native of Rapid City, South Dakota, concertizes extensively, maintaining an active concert schedule throughout the U.S. and Europe. He has presented concerts in 28 states as well as Germany, France, and England. Wyatt is a graduate of the University of Washington School of Music with a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in organ performance. His Masters of Music is from the Yale Institute of Sacred Music and the Yale School of Music. Wyatt earned the Bachelor of Music degree from

the University of South Dakota.

This performance of the Goldberg Variations will be performed in Wells Hall, to capture a more intimate experience of the music, in keeping with the original intent of its composition. Wyatt and the harpsichord will be in the center of the room; attendees are invited to sit in a 360 degree circle around the performer, or even to listen from the mezzanine.


