There will be **only one Eucharist** celebrated on **Sunday, September 18, Moving Forward Sunday, at 10:30 AM**. The 8:30 AM Holy Eucharist will resume the following Sunday, September 25.

New Liturgical Music and Return of Regular Choir

In the service at 10:30am this Sunday you will notice several changes from previous weeks. One of those changes is a new musical setting of the liturgy: gone are the familiar tunes of "Allein Gott" for the Hymn of Praise, and the "Land of Rest" for the Sanctus. Instead, we're moving forward with a

new musical setting for the "Glory to God," "Holy Holy," and the Fraction Anthem, written by Peter Crisafulli. It is a very lively and singable setting.

Peter Crisafulli is organist and choirmaster at All Saints Church in Chevy Chase, MD. Many of his compositions have been published and are in widespread use throughout the USA.

This Sunday we welcome back the choir (who will lead the congregation in the singing of the new liturgy). With the choir, we also welcome the Choral Scholars: a welcome back to Larissa Gaulke, soprano, student at University of Puget Sound; Rae Hyra, alto, student at Pacific Lutheran University; Jack Burrows, bass, recent graduate of Tacoma Community College, and currently a student at PLU; and a new welcome to TJ Wheeler, tenor, a recent graduate of PLU. Together with myself at the organ or piano, I hope that all together we can be a meaningful part of the worship service.





Earshot Jazz, 31 Oct. 2017) Indeed, the world-renowned Earshot Jazz Festival, which takes place all around Seattle this year from October 8 through November 6, features artists from a wide variety of jazz genres, including big band music, gospel,

and even today's hip hop.

Cassio Vianna, who is the Director of Jazz Studies at PLU, is not only a jazz pianist, he is also an award-winning composer, music educator and jazz scholar. His most recent album, the CD *Infância* (Cassio Vianna Jazz Orchestra 2017) features his recent compositions for jazz big band. He performs regularly with the PLU Regency Jazz Ensemble, the Tom Bergeron Brasil Band, the Vianna Bergeron Brazilian Jazz, and as an accompanist with singer Sherry Alves.

In addition to being a freelance saxophonist all around the PNW, **Jeff Chang** is a frequent clinician and master class teacher, and is the band director at Decatur High School in Federal Way, along with acting as the Jazz Curriculum Officer for the Washington Music Educator Association.






