7 PM in the Parish Library with **Dustin Crummert**


On Sunday, October 2, we will celebrate the Blessing of Animals in the courtyard. Dustin says: Some influential schools of Christian thought have held that we have no, or only very minimal, obligations to animals. But if we consult sources like reason, the Bible, or Jesus, this turns out to be false, and the result is that we should often treat animals differently than we currently do. 

Mysteries of the Columbarium

The Christ Church Columbarium, located below the chapel in Trinity House has been in use since 1958. It is a quiet and peaceful place where our loved ones are honored. There are 180 niches, with many holding the ashes of multiple people. We have a map/directory of who is interred in each niche, as well as which niches are reserved.

As with any institution with a long history, there is sometimes missing information. While updating the Columbarium Map, we discovered a few gaps. There are people with reserved spaces listed on the map for whom we have no current knowledge.

So we are turning to collective knowledge and memory of the parish to see if we can fill those gaps.

In the oldest portion of the columbarium we have empty niches reserved for people who are no longer in our parish list. Assuming that these people have already died and

been interred somewhere else, we would like to free up those empty niches to allow interment of new people. But first we would like to know if anyone has information about these former members of our family.

We have a number of niches which hold the




