

#### A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

his past Sunday, September 25, a parish member challenged by a mental health disorder entered the sacristy before worship where she spoke to me, insisting that she was going to speak at length during the Holy Eucharist. It was clear to me and others that her prescribed medication had not been taken. Much of her speech was confusing; it also vacillated between sounding friendly and angry, bordering on belligerence. I said that she was welcome to speak with friends during coffee hour but this invitation was refused and I was told where I could go. At this point, our senior warden, Christi McCarren, assisted in escorting her to an entryway pew where they were able to sit for much of the service. As I was about to pronounce the final blessing, our troubled member entered the church, having ripped a No Trespassing sign from its holding, began yelling, and then threw the metal sign in the direction of the altar party. Her eyes, however, were on me.

This is not the first time and, no doubt, will not be the last time someone enters worship who is agitated, confused, or belligerent. A number of parishioners told me that they were frightened by the yelling and throwing of an object that would hurt someone. As you know, we do not worship in private; ours is a public worship. We pray

for and care for members, friends, and strangers who are in need as witnessed by our senior warden who only a few weeks ago invited a highly agitated man to sit with her for the service. Why was he agitated? He was hungry. Luckily our senior warden had something that he could eat. When he left, he gave her a sweet peck on the check and thanked her. But a bite of food would not calm someone hallucinating and in a highly aggressive mood.

Our goal is to Care and to Protect. And in pursuing the latter, our desire is to ensure that our worship space is a safe one for all; that no one feels threatened by yelling, by belligerent acts, or by verbal threats. To this end we are working to bring an expert in de-escalating belligerent activity to coach our staff and ushers. At the same time, we recognize that there are degrees of agitation: some can be cared for with a friendly word or a willingness to listen. At other times, however, when harm seems possible, another response is needed. We aspire to provide Care and Protection. As our colleagues in other churches and in the city's one synagogue make clear: we have a moral and a legal responsibility to ensure that no harm is done in the house of God. We ask for your prayerful support.


#### **Spiritual Gifts Inventory**



#### **Vestry News**

The most important news to share is that your Vestry voted on September 20th not to call another Interim Rector. Fr. Torvend has graciously agreed to stay in his current role as part time Priest for Worship, Adult Formation and Pastoral Care through the end of the year. At that time, we will reevaluate where we stand relative to our Rector Call.

#### **Profile Committee**

Our Profile Committee is writing in earnest and should have a completed document by the end of October. As such, plans for a Search Committee are underway. More information to follow in October.

#### **Financial Status**

We continue to track well with our 2022 budget. As of the end of August, our revenue was \$6668 over budget. During the same period expenses were under by \$39,016, spread evenly across all expense categories. We must remain cautious as our expenses continue to exceed our income by \$106,545 year to date. We close this gap through budgeted Fund Transfers.

#### **Rental Income Fall 2022**

Thanks to the proactive efforts of our Parish Administrator, Deborah Breneman, we are seeing a significant increase in rentals.

#### A world premiere by American Sufi composer, Forrest Farhad Pierce

In THE VALLEYS, The Esoterics is excited to present a world-premiere commission by Forrest Farhad Pierce: *The atlas of the way*. Originally from the Columbia Plateau of Washington state, Pierce is now Professor of Composition at the University of Kansas, a member of the faculty of the Cortona Sessions for New Music, a wayfarer of both mountains and valleys, and a teacher of Sufism in the Inayati tradition. Pierce writes music of meditative stillness and ecstatic virtuosity that is rooted in a deep connection to the natural world.

In his Atlas, Pierce has created a concert-length a cappella choral work based on the epic Sufi poem, The conference of the birds [Mantiq ut-Tair], by Farid ud-Din Attar (1145-1221). As both poet and composer, Pierce has distilled nearly five thousand couplets of this ancient poem into a nine-movement work, with eight interludes (called sohbets). Pierce's piece describes the journey of a gathering of curious birds who are led by their teacher - the hoopoe - to learn of their own origin. Through this vast land-scape, the birds traverse seven evocatively-named valleys - of farawayfaring, lovestruckness, kenning, enoughing, onement, wonderstruckness, and

noughtness - each representing a Sufi maqam, or spiritual station of progress. Between each musical valley, Pierce's insterstitial sohbets capture quiet, intimate conversations between student and teacher in which they reflect on this spiritual journey.



I have exciting news! The electrical upgrade to support an HVAC system for Wells Hall has been almost completed and the work on the HVAC system is scheduled to start next week. We have been two long years without heat/cooling in this wonderful facility. I am so thankful that we can look forward to being warm when it is cool and cool when it is warm!

Just like in our own homes, however, when we make improvements, other needs emerge. Thanks to the diligent work of our Parish Administrator, Deborah Brenneman, we are renting space in Wells Hall multiple times a month. And, of course, it is our central gathering place for socializing and Parish Life events.

Look around the next time you are in Wells Hall. Look at the bathrooms (upstairs and down). Look at the kitchen, our classrooms, and the stage. This is the picture we present to all who enter our "living room." I cannot predict the future. We know that we have some serious space and financial planning to do over the next 3-5 years. However, in the interim, the impression that others who only join us in this space, is a bit beyond "Shabby Chic." And, as we use the space, it is important for us to both feel safe and comfortable as well.

The Vestry has put together a preliminary list of projects that would make Wells Hall more presentable in this interim time while we are planning. These are not big projects, but rather smaller projects that would greatly improve the appearance, safety, and usability of Wells Hall as a venue as well as for our Parish. I am including the list below. All costs

are "estimates" based on proposals and/or other information. Please note that this is not an exhaustive list.


