## A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

ach Sunday we find visitors coming to Christ Church, taking a peek at what we do and who we are. We know that many visitors to churches in the Pacific Northwest wonder what kind of

people they will encounter: "Will church people ignore us or greet us and greet us without pressuring us?" I am mindful of the first time I stepped into an Episcopal church so many years ago, unfamiliar with the Book of Common Prayer. A soft-spoken grandmother sitting close to me greeted me and then said, "If you need any help with 'the books,' I'll be glad to assist." No pressure. No assuming I was lost. Just a simple and kind gesture. "Oh," I thought, "she noticed me." How different that was from the choir director who rushed to welcome newcomers, asking them to join the choir after they had been in the church for less than 60 minutes!

Being attentive to others with a simple nod of the head or "Hello," lets visitors know that we see them without pressuring them. At the same Episcopal parish I visited so long ago, a younger woman (who turned out to be the rector's spouse), came up to me and said, "Could I get you a cup of coffee or tea?" The Bible reader in me thought: "I was thirsty and you gave me a cup of water."

Such a simple question to ask, expressing a gentle and genuine hospitality.



Please join us for an **Open House** in the Choir Room **after our 10:30 a.m. Service** on **Sunday, September 11th.** Last June, Junior Warden **Nancy Gow Knudsen** and Choir Librarian **Anne Avery** acquired three gently used four drawer filing cabinets to replace

ceed Anne as Choir Librarian on Sunday. They had lots of help! Interim Music Director **Paul Tegels** moved the project along much further than originally envisioned. Choir member and Organist **Van Hardison** used the music database to create and

two spent four drawer files and a three drawer file in the Choir Room at one third of the cost of new. The idea was to create a bit of space in full very drawers.

That was done and then one



thing led to another. Nine weeks later over one thousand sets of music in the room have been relocated. The large wall cabinets which held nearly four hundred sets of music have been replaced by five more four drawer files from our original source, making this music far more accessible. The wall cabinets have found a new home in the church school. Large print music moved to file drawers opening access to a corner counter that hadn't been seen in years. Five drawers of Psalms also have new homes so that over nine hundred anthems are now filed in full numerical sequence.

Much of this work was accomplished by Anne Avery and **Susan Beer** who will sucprint over eight hundred file labels. Congregants Fran Blair, Pat Hendrix, Brianne Knudson, Vikke Pierson, Michael Menne and others who are unknown answered our call and provided over six hundred gently used file folders. Sexton Tim Williams moved file and wall cabinets as well as rearranged the choir room to facilitate the work and disposed of our recyclables. Church Administrator Deborah Breneman also contributed to the project along the way. We were helped one day by Meg Mansfield, a former choir librarian, who shared some history of the collection. Our thanks to all! It was truly a community effort. We look forward to showing you the finished project!

On **Friday, September 16, at 12:10pm**, Christ Church Parish welcomes organist **Marc Fitze.** Marc is titular organist at the Heiliggeistkirche in Berne, professor for organ at the Conservatory of Berne, and artistic director of the Baroque Center of Heiliggeistkirche.

He performs regularly in Switzerland, Germany, Italy, France, United Kingdom, Spain, Ukraine, Mexico, Israel, the Nederlands, the USA and Japan. In recent years he has taken part as a soloist in many prestigious concert series and performed at the Lucerne Festival, Minato Mirail Hall Yokohama, Eglise St. Clothilde de Paris, Victoria Hall Genève, International Organ Festival Rapallo, St. Bavo Haarlem, among others.

He has made radio and CD recordings in Switzerland and in the USA. He is a member of the Association des Amis de l'Art de Marcel Dupré, and vice-president of the international Jehan Alain association based in Romainmôtier.

Marc Fitze received his musical training at the Music Academy Basel in the organ class of Guy Bovet, and the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston with Prof. Yuko Hayashi. He completed his master diploma and soloist's diploma in Basel 2002.



He was awarded the Hans-Balmer prize for the best organ diploma of the year. During and after those studies he participated in masterclasses with Marie-Claire Alain, Jean

> He has also specialized in the art harmonium and its historical performance, and has a private collection of historical Mustel instruments. As harmonium player he




