A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

Caution: Things Have Changed

Those who watch the parish calendar will recognize that during the week and on weekends, during the day and into the evening, many spaces in the parish are now being rented to outside groups for meetings, rehearsals, receptions, and other projects. This means that we can no longer assume, as we did before the pandemic, that spaces once used and used frequently without reservation are available. They are not.

We are supporting our financial health by renting these spaces to various groups: the church, Wells Hall, the gymnasium under Wells Hall, the Fireplace Room, the kitchen, the Parish Library, and the Green Room. The staff ask this of all members and friends: please do not assume that a space is available.

Each and every parish event needs to be scheduled with our Parish Administrator, Deborah Breneman. Your request for space needs to be directed to Deborah. This includes any extended coffee hours (potlucks) on Sundays (as we have groups who begin to use Wells Hall at 1:30 PM which requires clean up and resetting the room), soup suppers, team or committee meetings, prayer gatherings, and classes. Please do not assume that a space is yours simply because it is a parish event: speak with Deborah. We ask for your kind assistance in this matter so that we have clear coordination of our many spaces and so that we can ensure that Christ Church Parish events are given priority in scheduling. Thank you.

Earth Ministry


The leadership of Earth Ministry is unable to join us

Emergency Food Network (EFN) is the central non-profit food distributor for Pierce County, serving a network of more than 75 food pantries, meal sites, and shelters. In 2022, EFN distributed more than 13 million pounds of food and supported 2 million food pantry visits. A large percentage of the food pantry visits were on behalf of children and seniors. These are the neighbors most in need of our help. They are able to distribute a meal for just \$0.50, so every dollar you give will have an incredible impact in our community.
