A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem

During Holy Week and the Easter season, Episcopalians in this country have been drawn to consider our relationship with Anglicans in the Middle East. Indeed, it is our practice to send donations to the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem, a diocese that counts members and leaders in Israel, Palestine, Jordan, Lebanon, and Syria.

Though it is a small diocese in terms of members, its presence is palpable: the diocese sponsors thirty institutions, including hospitals, schools, clinics, rehabilitation centers, guesthouses, and retirement homes. The diocesan cathedral is in Jerusalem and the bishop of the diocese is the Most Rev. Hosam Elias Naoum, a Palestinian Anglican. 
Earth Ministry

The Cosmic Dimension of the Resurrection



In 2022, EFN distributed more than 13 million pounds of food and supported 2 million food pantry visits. A large percentage of the food pantry visits were on behalf of children and seniors. 2023 Annual Deacons' Retreat

This year's Annual Deacons' Retreat met this past March at the Seabeck Community Conference Center. The focus at this year's retreat was *Transitions*.

"Deacon Missy Couch had these thoughts about the retreat: '...As we reunited we laughed, played, and prayed together with a specific topic on which to ponder and reflect: Transitions. Archdeacon **Gen Grewell** announced that, after much discernment and prayer, she is leaving the role as our Archdeacon on June 30. However, she will still be semi-active as a deacon in the community. **

'With that knowledge our community went through the weekend imagining what our Diocese will be like in this time of transition.... The myriad of duties, which Gen has performed so capably, is vast and wide. The Archdeacon serves as the Bishop's righthand in all things Diaconal. What will it take to fill the shoes of our beloved Gen? After several sessions of prayer and discussion about what our community may need and want in our next Archdeacon, our facilitator, the Rev Canon Arienne Davison, asked us to continue praying for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and to ponder our own role in this Transition. We will be regathering in mid-June to pray once more and share our insights.

'In this time of transition our Community will continue to take Christ's redemptive love into the world, especially to those on the margins, and to interpret to the Church the hopes, needs, and concerns of the world.' " (ecww.or/2023-annual-deacons-retreat, Josh Hornbeck, April 19, 2023)
