#### A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

#### Table, Food, and Waiter

This past Wednesday, I participated in a Zoom meeting with our bishop, the Most Rev. Melissa Skelton. As the cochair of the diocesan Commission on Liturgy and the Arts, I was asked to discuss what the Commission will be up to in the months ahead now that parishes have returned to in person worship.

One point of discussion concerned the use of expansive language for God. Bishop Skelton was clear on this: we'll not be dropping the traditional baptismal formula of Father, Son, and Spirit, but we will seek more images that and here's the point - expand our understanding of the Holy Three, images found throughout the Scriptures and in the Christian tradition.



Saturday, April 29, is the feast of **St. Catherine of Siena**, a 14<sup>th</sup> century Italian mystic and social activist who received messages from the Holy Trinity collected in her famous work, *The Dialogue of Divine Providence*. Faithful in praying the Daily Office, she was inspired

to compose her own prayers, one of which expands the image of the Holy Trinity:

#### Indebted to the Jewish Community

The farther Christians stray from their Jewish origins, the greater our ignorance of the debt we owe to the Jewish community. After all, the One to whom we give thanks in the liturgy was and is a **Galilean Jew**:

in his resurrection from the deathly tomb, Jesus did not shed his Jewishness and suddenly become an Anglican Christian! And speaking of Easter - or better yet, **Pascha**, the original name for this feast - we know that its date shifts each year, influenced first by the dating of the Jewish feast of **Passover** which takes place on the first night of a full moon after the Spring equinox. We follow this pattern: Easter is the first Sunday after the full moon after the Spring Equinox. And have you noticed the text we sing as the Easter Fraction Anthem: "Christ our Passover"?

Indeed, the Christian sense of time in the Great Tradition follows the Jewish sense of time: the day begins with sunset and ends with sunset the following day. The day does not begin at midnight or at dawn. Thus, Christmas begins with sunset on December 24; the Three Days begin with sunset on Maundy Thursday; and Pascha begins with sunset on Holy Saturday at the Vigil. And then there are the Fifty Days of Easter rooted in the Jewish keeping of 50 days that flow from Passover and conclude with the Jewish feast of Shavuot, an agricultural festival marking the ingathering or harvest of wheat. Pentecost: from the Greek for "the fiftieth." Yes, we keep Fifty Days of Paschal or Easter rejoicing as we discern each year what it might mean for us to "walk in newness of life."

And, of course, there is this: it's a challenge to understand the meaning of the New Testament, the Christian Scriptures, if one does not read and study the **Hebrew Scriptures**, the matrix in which the gospels and letters emerged. As Christians, we owe much to the ancient Jewish community: our sense of time, many of our cherished rituals, the Daily Office, and our primary text, the Bible. As Christians, we do well to honor our "older" brothers and sisters who have persevered in their faithfulness to the covenant God made with them at Sinai, a faithfulness that has been tested, tragically, but much Christian antisemitism.


#### Sunday, May 21 12 Noon in the Parish Library Images from the East
