A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

Mid-stream

We have celebrated the Institution of the Lord's Supper and this evening we will keep vigil with Christ in his passion: come prepared to hear our choral scholars sing a beautiful and haunting setting of the gospel reading from John. On Saturday, the chief liturgy of the entire year - the Great Vigil of Easter - will begin at 8:00 PM. Should there be rain, we will gather in the covered walkway between Wells Hall and the church for the lighting of the New Fire, the blessing of the Paschal Candle, and our procession into the church with flickering flames. We will celebrate the baptism of Savannah McClellan, the newest member of the Christ Church - what an incredible joy to be with her! - and the First Eucharist of Easter.

What might surprise some is that the Easter Vigil is the first celebration of Easter. Those who participate in the Vigil liturgy need not return on Easter Sunday (well, with a few exceptions: musicians, clergy, and other liturgical ministers!). As one of my liturgy professors said years ago: "We should expect to be both *inspired* and *exhausted* after three days of intense ritualizing as such ritual taps into deeper dimensions of our lives." Yes, may the power of these actions and words deepen our love for Christ, for each other, and for the world itself.

Worship 101





This towering paschal candle is made possible by the work of bees and human labor. Paschal is the Romanized form of Passover, as in the passover of the Hebrews from slavery to freedom, the passover of Jesus from death into life, and our

passover in baptism from the powers of this world to the radiant kingdom of God. We have evidence from the late 4th century of a song in "praise of the candle" to be used at Easter. Consequently, for close to 1,500 years, Christians have gathered around the Paschal or Easter candle as a symbol of the light of Christ that radiates forth from his resurrection. We might say that it is our pillar of fire that guides us through the year and blesses every baptism, every renewal of the baptismal covenant, and every funeral liturgy. This year our great thanks are due to Milana McLead who has prepared the adorning of the candle. Thanks are also due to Caroline Huckaby for preparing a second candle that, with its presence, will bless Trinity Chapel and all who worship there.

Third Annual Psalm-A-Rama Saturday, April 8 9:00am in the Chapel

Join members of the parish in the time-honored practice of holding vigil by praying the psalter. We begin in the Chapel following morning prayer at 9:00 AM. There is a 10-minute break every hour. Lunch is from 12:00 -1:00 in Trinity Library. We anticipate being finished in the sanctuary around 4:00PM.

Lunch and snacks provided. You are welcome to stay for a few minutes or for the entire transformative experience.

At the Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 8, Savannah McClellan will be baptized and anointed as one of Christ's own. Her sponsor is David Pierce who was confirmed by Bishop Melissa Skelton this past Advent. It is an incredible joy to witness such a momentous thing in a culture that seems ambivalent if not skeptical concerning any kind of affiliation with spiritual community. Might you consider being present to welcome Savannah into this parish and its common life?

Alleluia, Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

Happy Easter! Happy season of Resurrection! Have you ever heard the phrase, "we are a Resurrection people"? What does that mean? It means that we live, or try our best to live, into the promise of Jesus' resurrection from the dead. His emerging from darkness to light allows us to move from despair to hope, from sadness to joy. We can relate to Mary in the garden, when she sees Jesus and recognizes him: pure joy when just a moment before she felt anguish.

What has been your "resurrection" time? I think of childbirth, both when our daughter was born and also when she birthed our grandbabies. The (often) long and painful labor seemed to never end. But then the indescribable euphoria of new birth.

Sometimes, we have the privilege of providing "resurrection" to someone, or something else. When we adopted our puppy from the SPCA, she was sad, confused, uncertain of where she was or where she was going. But we brought her home, and she started living her second life, her resurrection.

It is indeed joyful to live in resurrection times, and it is an incredible blessing to be able to help others into their resurrection time. This is truly being Jesus for others.

Starting soon, we will have a unique opportunity at Christ Church to be that for someone else. We are starting a new ministry, called One Parish One Prisoner (www.undergroundministries.org/opop).

Did you know that there are roughly the same number of men and women in Washington state prisons as there are churches in Washington? The question is, what if every church or parish became a local reentry team – a resurrection community – to walk alongside just one neighbor leaving the tombs of incarceration?

We at Christ Church will be that partner, that resurrection team, for one releasing friend. The team at Underground Ministries will prepare us, provide us with resources and support as we take this journey. They will pair us with one person being released to our area, whom we will assist in their walk away from the darkness of a cell to the light of freedom.

We will provide support such as pre-release housing search, rides to appointments, job connections, funds to pay stranglehold fines, and more; but mostly we will build a trusted friendship and community for our friend. "It's the reality of personal relationships that saves everything." ~Thomas Merton

This is not a small undertaking. It is a 2-year journey, starting with the preparation provided by the Underground Ministries team and material, through the relationship building with our new releasing friend, and on to the ups and downs of their journey after release as they navigate the unknowns and challenges of their new life, their resurrection life.
