A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

Faith and Food?

The earliest description of Christian worship was written by a convert to the faith named Justin, a man who was eventually executed by the Roman state for his loyalty to Jesus Christ. In his description, Justin notes that after the people have received the gifts of God in the bread and wine, the Body and Blood of Christ, a collection is taken and is used to feed those who are hungry, homeless, and struggling with poverty. Please note the movement from *receiving* food and drink - bread and wine - to *sharing* food and drink with those who are hungry.

What Justin suggests is the ethical dimension of the Holy Eucharist: as God comes to us in Christ with life, health and wholeness so the sacramental community extends this hospitality to those who seek food and drink: the most basic human need. Here sacrament and ethics are joined.

We continue this ancient Christian practice by supporting **Emergency Food Network**, the county's center for the distribution of food to the majority of free meal sites and food pantries. Here's a shocking fact: over 51% of all households in Pierce County report **food insecurity**, that is, not having sufficient food to feed a family to the end of a month. **51**% And EFN reports that this percentage is growing.

Worskip 101

Have you had a chance to enter the altar platform and take a look at the Paschal Candle? Please do and note the detailed needlework created by Christ Church member, Milana McLead. The Paschal Candle burns brightly through-

out the Easter Season, through Pentecost Sunday, and then burns brightly at the celebration of Holy Baptism and at Funeral Eucharists. Indeed, the funeral liturgy is a baptismal liturgy: as one enters the Christian community through baptism, so the community bids farewell to their beloved dead with baptismal rituals: the sprinkling of baptismal water, the use of white pall reminiscent of the white garment worn at baptism, Easter hymns, and the Paschal Candle burning brightly next to the urn or casket.



The Holy Eucharist with the Rite of Commendation for **Jason Schroedel** will be celebrated on Saturday, May 13, at 11:30 in the morning in the church. Following the Eucharist, lunch will be served in Wells Hall. Members and friends of Christ Church are cordially invited to attend.
