An Important Message from Christi McCarren, Senior Warden

or the past several years, we have been transparent and open in discussing the financial needs of the parish as we move forward. Over the past few months, members of the vestry have done a careful and detailed study of our expenses and revenue sources. Our study leads us to conclude that we will be faced with a situation in which our operating expenses will soon increase beyond our current ability to bring in offsetting revenue. This reality will create a grave **budgetary crisis** in 2025 when our supporting fund balances from endowments will be depleted.

The Vestry believes our best strategy in confronting this difficult situation is to use **Wells Hall** to its fullest potential; to turn what has been a financial drain into a financial asset. Our recent Wells Hall capital campaign turned the ship for us and allowed us to see our future differently. We could not have done this without your support and commitment. For this, we are profoundly grateful.

What is our current situation?

- While we have welcomed over 20 new members to the parish in the past year, our pledging units have remained stable, between 78-80. New pledges have offset those we have lost through moves, transfers, or death; we have not gained new income.
- The loss of MultiCare tenancy in Trinity House (as of May 2023) has created a loss of \$30,000 income annually.
- We had a highly successful capital campaign to refurbish

Wells Hall to support increased space rentals. We will continue to need repairs and maintenance of our aging facilities.

 We are glad to report that we have experienced a significant increase in rental income in late 2022 and throughout 2023.

The Vestry has concluded that we will need \$150,000/year in rental income by 2025 to offset our increasing expenses. A bolder, multi-pronged strategy is essential to optimize the use of Wells Hall and render it a financial asset.

How do we increase our rental income to \$150,000 annually?

- We continue to develop our relationship with the Arts Community: Tacoma Opera, Tacoma City Ballet, local and regional choral groups, organ societies. We are currently in negotiations with Tacoma City Ballet and the Opera to rent a substantial portion of Wells Hall including the gym and many smaller rooms.
- Continue the use of Wells

Hall for large group events: meetings, retreats, receptions.

 Begin offering weddings and wedding receptions in Wells Hall.

What will the impact be to our community?

Simply put, Wells Hall will be less available to us on a daily basis. However, there are a few non-negotiables with our potential renters. Wells Hall will be reserved for Christ Church use on Sunday mornings for coffee hour and all Parish Life events. The kitchen remains Christ Church space. We have already scheduled Parish I ife calendar our through 2024 so we are guaranteed the space. We will continue this practice moving forward. Adult and children's formation programs will be cared for in Trinity House, the chapel, and/or on Zoom. But, a bolder strategy does mean that the flexibility of lastminute events may be compromised.

How will we mitigate the decreased availability of Wells Hall?

We have the opportunity to

"rethink" the use of other existing space in Trinity House. For example: if several of the rooms on the second floor of Wells Hall are rented, we would move Godly Play to the second floor of Trinity House (in the previously occupied MultiCare space). If we lost meeting room space, would use our Parish Office and Library spaces to greater effect. We could also consider reconfiguring the Chapel to become a multipurpose space - for worship, meetings, and Adult Formation. The point is, we have options. Our large campus footprint can actually be used to support us differently and more effectively.

Many of us do not like to see changes to what we take for granted. But our future sustainability requires us to "give a little" to "gain a lot."

I was sorry to miss being with you on Sunday, June 18. I am glad to report that I have received **two negative tests** for the covid virus. I am eager to return to church. I am most grateful for modern pharmacology and attentive healthcare providers.

But I also know that there are members of our parish who face ongoing challenges in finding adequate healthcare. Our means of assisting parishioners with unexpected healthcare needs is through the **Rector's Discretionary Fund.** Our donations to that Fund enable our leadership to make a real difference in the lives of those who find themselves slipping through the cracks in the healthcare systems of the region.

According to the Tacoma Pierce County Health Department, one of the most pressing needs is for therapists and counselors. The percentage of persons who are struggling with **anxiety**, **loneliness**, and **depression** is quite high. If you find yourself in such a situation, please let your parish priest or senior warden know. We maintain absolute confidence. We can help direct you toward professional counselors.

About Sacred Ground

During the luncheon last Sunday honoring Gen Grewell's retirement as Archdeacon of the Diocese, mention was made of <u>Sacred Ground: A Film based Dialogue Series on Race and Faith</u> that Archdeacon Gen and Deacon Donna

offered during the Pandemic. This is a rich curriculum covering the experiences of Blacks, Latinxs, Asians, LGBTQ+, and Jews, among others.

There are opportunities to share views and values, to consider related questions within the context of our faith and to reflect on the experience of those who have long known discrimination in our country. We were asked to read various articles and to watch selected films in preparation for each of ten sessions. Our group of about a dozen participants met twice a month over five months in 2021.

This is a stimulating and enlightening program developed by our National Church. In this time when living our professed belief that "All 'people' are created equal" is so critical, this course is a deep well of history, information and inclusiveness.

If Sacred Ground sounds of interest, please talk to Deacon Donna. It is a wonderful opportunity to improve your knowledge and perspective.

I used to teach history. There is a lot in Sacred Ground that was never in our text books. From my perspective, Sacred Ground is a not to be missed opportunity!

Search Committee Update

Christ Church Tacoma's Rector Search Committee has completed the following:

- 1) Development of the Job Description, based largely on the Profile, for posting purposes.
- 2) Posting of our opening on the Diocese of Olympia's "Office for Transition Ministries" and the "Episcopal News" websites (both closed as of June 2).
- 3) Development of the evaluation criteria and related scoring approach for the applicant written material we will receive from the diocese following their vetting process.
- 4) Draft of the Applicant Interview Questions and related Scoring approach we will use.

We are now waiting to receive the vetted applicant written information. The timing of receiving this information is dependent on the number of applicants the diocese has received overall and the number that are from outside the Diocese of Olympia (since vetting those takes more time). Once we have the written information, the Search Committee will review it to determine which applicants we will interview.


Tacoma Pride


