# A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

It's never too late for good news

I am in Houston as I write this, speaking at a conference on higher education as the temperature outside is edging toward 93 degrees with high, high humidity (don't you just love living by the Puget Sound with our usually moderate summer temperatures?). Last week, I received this note from Mike Collier.

I wrote this on Easter Monday after worshipping with your community for the Easter Vigil. The Great Vigil of Easter was wonderful. Standing in the dark rain outside of the stone church, watching the Easter fire, and hearing the entreaties to come set the mood. Processing into the dimly lit sanctuary with tall tapered candles flickering allowed for a mystical and worshipful experience. This was the 38th time I have attended, assisted as a worship leader, or presided at the Easter Vigil: first in Latin, then German, and finally English. It never ceases to amaze me to hear the ancient text of the Exultet that starts the service proper. The cantor who chanted this at Christ Church struck just the right note. The setting of the stone church and the musical proclamations of the choir were perfect! The deep pastoral care of the newly baptized encouraged the congregation towards celebration of this milestone event for both the recipient and the Church at large: I have always loved this service. Being a part of Christ Church's Easter Vigil really fed my soul. Sorry this took so long to get to you. I have been traveling for my work, consulting with congregations.

# Worship 101

It's common prayer, not my prayer
A longtime member of Christ
Church asked me recently if we
could have a chat concerning the
Nicene Creed. For a second, I
thought it might concern the content of the Creed but, in fact, this
member raised another concern:
"It seems that some people rush
through the Creed as if it's something to get done and over with rather than something to contemplate, to take into one's being."

There is a good measure of truth in her comment given that one can hear some voices speaking quite quickly and others speaking at a more measured rate the common texts we share. Honestly, at times it can sound like we are praying on different speeds - 33 1/3 rpm, 45

rpm, and 78 rpm - rather than praying with one common voice. It can be jarring to hear some in the assembly finish speaking a text while other finish 5 seconds later. Is that common prayer?

Her concern raises questions: Are we listening to each other, moderating our pace with others?

Are we just rattling off well-known texts or engaging in prayerful consideration of the texts and their meaning? Consider this: commas and periods in a text invite a brief pause, a catch your breath - no different than singing.

But, then, one might say, "I just want to get out of church in 60 minutes. Who cares if we speak quickly?" Well, there are plenty of churches that rush through worship: why not try one of them? (But keep this in mind: one of the strongest criticisms by members of Generation Z of Christian worship is "rushing to get through it, as if the words have no meaning"). As one vestry member noted in our discussion of this question: "At Christ Church, we take the time needed. We neither rush it nor do we unnecessarily prolong our common prayer."

#### **Guided tour of Christ Church**

Many of you might remember the Holy Eucharist on December 11, 2022, when our Bishop Provisional, Melissa Skelton, presided, preached, and confirmed David Pierce and Ann Welton. You might

also remember that she said how delighted she was to worship in what she considers the most beautiful worship space in the diocese: no small thing to say given the 100 parish churches of the diocese.

The building is not only a place where we gather together in the presence of the Triune God; it also proclaims in design, color, art, vessels, and layout the Gospel of Jesus Christ. On **Sunday, June 25, at 12 Noon**, Ron Fields, Professor of Art History Emeritus at UPS, Christ Church member, and a leader in our Liturgical Arts Team will give **a guided tour** of the space. If you have time, join Ron for this walk through our amazing *beton brut* space.



## Contra Dance in Wells Hall

For many years, Wells Hall has been the site of contra dancing,

usually held on the third Saturday of each month. The events include a live band and caller, and many dancers. This is a great chance to have fun. Our next dance is on June 17, and all are welcome!

Contra dancing is done in long lines. You and your partner form a small circle with a neighboring couple. The caller prompts you, such as "circle left," "circle right," "dosi-do" (back-to-back), and "swing your partner." After about thirty seconds, the tune starts again, and you and your partner meet new neighbors, and do the same recurring pattern of moves. After a while, you have danced with every-

one in the long line.

The dancers range from teenagers to age 80. A half-hour workshop for newcomers is held each month starting at 7:00 PM. We then dance from 7:30 to 10:00. The regular dancers are very welcoming to new dancers. Come alone, or come as a couple. We like to change partners every dance.

Contra dancing started in England as "country dancing" in long narrow halls. It was the height of fashion in 18<sup>th</sup>-century England, and came to America in colonial times. The Virginia Reel is an 18<sup>th</sup>-century dance. Washington and

Jefferson were avid contra dancers.

Contra dancing is similar to ceilidh dancing in England, Scotland, and Ireland---but much easier, because we have a caller to guide us through the dance, and we don't do a clogging step while dancing. We just walk in time to the music. Easy and fun!
