A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

Listening to the earth

I write this message from my room in the guesthouse of Saint John's Abbey and University. I am attending the second of three conferences in Minnesota, this second one devoted to monastic spirituality in the modern world. The Rule of Saint Benedict begins with this word, "Listen." What the Rule does not say but implies is this: "Be quiet, be silent so that you can actually hear another voice."



From my guestroom window, I can see Lake Sagatagan through the trees. It is a beautiful sight. Such is not the case in other parts of the nation: flooding in Vermont; catastrophic heat throughout the southern tier of the US; smoke flowing down from Canadian forest fires. Things are actually burning up (take a look at Arizona).


The Rule says, Listen. I encourage us to listen well to what the earth is telling us. And then having listened, let us consider local, state, and federal leaders as we come closer to an election year: are they working vigorously to reduce climate change by ending dependence on fossil fuels? And are we doing whatever we can to reduce our use of fossil fuels that are heating the planet, reducing our dependence so that humans, animals, fish, birds, seas, coral reefs, and glaciers might not only survive but also flourish in the years ahead? The earth is speaking. Let us listen.






Our Care for Creation


