



A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

What's under the iceberg?

When my spouse and I were being trained in our diocesan College of Congregational Development, we were amused when asked to draw an iceberg floating in the water. Believe me: It's not that difficult to draw. A waterline with the tip of the iceberg showing above it and the bulk of the iceberg showing below it. (Does the Titanic come to mind?) Once we finished our sketching, the leader suggested that the iceberg is an image of a parish. What?

She went on to say that above the waterline is what is heard and discussed at meetings, over coffee hour, in a sermon or in a class, in newsletters and reports. What's below the waterline - the bulk of the iceberg - are private conversations - sometimes about what is working well but also



what appears to be going wrong in a parish. Below the waterline, one can discern the heavy weight of "we've always done it this way." Below the waterline, one can find resistance to change as well as the temptation to gossip.

In the near future, a new rector will come to Christ Church and that person may well have some new ideas, new initiatives, and new ways of doing things. This should come as a surprise to no one. For a parish to flourish, much less survive, leaders are called to discern what the are strengths of a parish and build on those strengths. They are also called to discern what is weak and in need of strengthening. And, yes, there may be some practices that just need to go.

Here is what will help a new rector as well as the staff and ministry leaders: honest conversations face-to-face and, if it arises, cordial disagreement, also face-to-face. What we learned in congregational development is the need to bring what is below the waterline in to the light above so that whatever is happening can be considered openly and constructively.



All whales that move in the water

The Book of Common Prayer contains a number of canticles assigned for Morning and Evening Prayer, biblical canticles that possess a wholistic view of the creation. In the Song of the Three Young Men (in the fiery furnace: Daniel 3), the three youths invite the creation to praise God: "Glorify the Lord, springs of water, seas, and streams, O whales and all that move in the waters. All you birds in the sky, give praise and exalt God." What's so interesting about this ancient invitation addressed to creatures of sea and sky is that scientists today are learning more and more about the languages - yes the languages spoken by earth's creatures. What the writer of this hymn of praise suggests is that other creatures, in their own way, give thanks to their Creator for life. Here, one's attention is not narrowly focused on the human alone but on all those other creatures, a view far more expansive than the little me. The poet Christopher Smart expressed such delight in his poem, Jubilate Agno: "I will consider my Cat Jeoffry. For he is the servant of the Living God duly and daily serving him. For at the first glance of the glory of God in the East he worships in his way. For this is done by wreathing his body seven times round with elegant quickness." Well, the next time your cat or dog begins to wreathe his or her body round, look carefully for this gesture of praise. Listen


Sunday, August 20 Worship Committee




