A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

No denial of science here

The wild fires in western Canada, eastern Washington, and Oregon; the drought and torrential rains in California; and the catastrophic heat experienced in Arizona are signs, say scientists, of the effects of global warming. Indeed, there is universal scientific agreement on the reality of climate change due to human use of fossil fuels. Thus, it is surprising if not shocking to hear candidates running for public office flat out deny this stark reality.

By way of contrast, Pope Francis, the Orthodox Patriarch, Dimitrios, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, the

General Secretary of the Lutheran World Federation, the Rev. Dr. Anne Burghardt, and leaders of the World Council of Churches have joined to sup-

port a **Season of Creation** from September 1, the universal Day of Prayer for the Creation, through the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, October 4. This is a remarkable undertaking that unites the Orthodox, Roman Catholics, Anglicans, Lutherans, and many Protestant communions in a singular effort to support the reduction of fossil fuels - against furious opposition from the petroleum industry - and to serve as advocates for the earth and its many creatures: brought to life by the Word of God as we confess each Sunday in the Creed.

Mark Sunday, **October 15**, in your calendar as we gather to **Sing with the Earth: Evening Prayer with Christ Church Choir**, at 4 PM - one of our contributions in what we hope will be a Year of Creation.



Greetings, People of the Diocese of Olympia,






