A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

Keep beating a path

hen we read or listen to the gospels - in the liturgy, in lectio divina, in personal reading - we might be struck by the fact that Jesus spends time in prayer, that is, in listening to and in conversation with the One he called *abba* or father. At the conference I'm attending in Rome, one of the speakers underlined the importance of being engaged in prayer each day, "for without prayer, without awareness of the Spirit speaking to us or leading us, there can be no authentic Christian life."

Frederick Buechner offers some sage advice on prayer, the heartbeat of a Christian's life: "Whatever else it may or may not be, prayer is at least talking to yourself, and that in itself is not always a bad idea. Talk to yourself about your own life, about what you've done and what you've failed to do, and about who you are and who you wish you were and who the people you love are. Talk about what matters most to you, because if you don't, you may forget what matters most to you. Even if you don't believe anybody's listening, at least you'll be listening. But, then, remember: Somebody is listening. Keep on beating the path to God's door, because the one thing you can be sure of is that, down the path you beat with even your most half-cocked and halting prayer, the God you call upon will finally come." Amen.

as we reflect with Dr. Rasmussen on this important subject on climate change.





It's hard to imagine a greater contrast than the differences between Jesus' life & teaching and our culture's concept of 'SUCCESS'. If what we're doing doesn't get us appreciated, promoted, shared, and well-compensated, Americans know we must be failures, right?

Every inmate gets the message daily - they're failures. Their gifts aren't needed; their work is worthless; their lives are expendable. OPOP ministry commits to compassion toward those our larger culture has discarded, in the Name of the One Whose great 'failure' was the precondition for Resurrection and Redemption. Re-read the taunts of those gathered to mock Jesus as he suffered on the cross. They sound so familiar to anyone who deals with trolls on social media!

Walking with Sunni as she prepares to return to our society is a challenge for everyone whose ex-

pectations are formed by the myth of American 'meritocracy'. Underground Ministries advisors tell the OPOP team to expect her to fall short at some point, and to prepare to forgive the worst. Will we recognize how Jesus continually does that for us? Or will we fail, in our need to 'Succeed'? Please pray for us.
