A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

No one thought it would work

I write from the pilgrims' lodge at Canterbury Cathedral in SE England. This morning I walked to the ruins of St Augustine's Abbey — as in Augustine of Canterbury, the Benedictine monk who was sent from Rome in 597 to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the Angles and Saxons - a rowdy crowd who had suppressed the Christian faith some three hundred years before.

Augustine was skeptical of this project, but he persisted ... and in time, the rich seed of Christian faith and life grew into a



flourishing plant that eventually extended to Christ Church in Tacoma. Yes, our Anglican roots are here in Canterbury.

This morning in those ruins, with light rain spitting and wind blowing, I prayed for our beloved parish — for our common witness to the love of Jesus Christ. And I did so with Hope — because the people who form this parish are marked by persistence, charity, and

goodness. For that, I can only say, Thanks be to God.





As we move into cold and flu season, we have reactivated our Medical Advisory Team, which assisted parish leadership during the height of the COVID pandemic. The team will make recommendations to the Vestry and leadership on health topics, will develop related policies and procedures for the parish, and will provide training for leadership, staff, ushers, and other groups as needed.

Masking Guidelines

Christ Church will follow the masking guidelines published by the CDC, the Washington Department of Health, and the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department. Current guidelines are:

- Wear a well-fitting mask, N95 recommended, on public transportation, in healthcare settings like hospitals and clinics, and anywhere signs are posted requiring masks,
- Consider the following factors when deciding whether to wear a mask anywhere else:
 - ♦ Your vaccination status,
 - ♦ Your medical conditions,
 - ♦ Local conditions such as very crowded or poorly ventilated areas.
- The Medical Advisory Team will monitor the weekly COVID hospitalization rate, published by the Health Department, and following CDC recommendations:
 - When hospitalization rate is **Low** (as it has been for about a year) masking is not required.
 - ♦ If the rate moves into the **Medium** or **High** range the team will adjust masking guidance, again following CDC recommendations.

We respect everyone's ability to make the best decisions for themselves while honoring our Christian commitment to protect others through our actions. 
