#### A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

#### **Oblate Heaven!**

have arrived safely in Rome with my colleague, Fr. John Forman (St. Elizabeth's Burien). We are here to attend the World Congress of Benedictine Oblates.

What, you ask, is an **oblate**? An oblate is a baptized Christian, lay or ordained, who affiliates with a community (monastery) of Benedictine nuns or monks and does so for one's lifetime. Oblate comes from the old Latin word oblation: an offering.

The oblate offers him or herself to the monastic community and does this by engaging in **three practices**: praying alone or

with others the Daily Office (morning, noonday, evening, or nighttime/compline); spiritual reading of a great variety; and service to others. Guess what? That sounds a lot like

the model of the parish we employ at Christ Church: wor-

ship; formation; and service. What's distinctive about Benedictine spirituality is the Rule of Benedict, composed in the  $6^{\rm th}$  century not far from Rome.




