#### A Message from Fr. Samuel Torvend

#### Always with the people

For centuries, state and church have been intertwined with each other in many countries. In some nations that relationship has continued: Vladimir Putin was eager to gain the blessing of the Russian Orthodox Church for his invasion of Ukraine; Charles III was "divinely anointed" a monarch in Westminster Abbey - a church. Indeed, the Church of England, our mother church, is the state church in England.

Consequently, many Brits view the church as a government entity and its ministers as agents of the state (one's priest as a federal employee?). Church attendance in England is so low that on any given weekend there are more Muslims in English mosques than Anglicans in English churches.

In 1789, those who signed the U.S. Constitution were the first to break the relationship between state (political) and church (religious). Thus, the government cannot prefer one religion nor can it prevent the establishment of a religious community.

What this means is directly related to our common life at Christ Church: while we have leaders - both lay and ordained - ours is a form of spiritual life utterly dependent on *volunteers*, on people of goodwill and energy who support the life of the parish. It will not be long, we hope, before a candidate for rector is submitted to the vestry. We will have a rector, an ordained leader, and that is good. But let us never forget that the vitality of the parish always - *always* - rests with the people.


ONE PARISH ONE PRISONER
