The Nicene Creed: a new(ish) translation

You may have stumbled a bit over a new translation of the Nicene Creed in our bulletin last week. The translation given was approved in 1994 at the 71st General Convention, and will appear in new revisions of the BCP. It importantly shifts focus from Jesus' maleness to becoming fully human, a concise summary of a rich theology of salvation as ongoing growth in participation with God. It also removes the phrase "and the son" which did not appear in the original, ecumenically agreed upon, Greek version of the Creed. 


Birds
